

In the following sections we invite you to a virtual tour through the 4 floors of our Hardtmuseum.

Take a look at the photos of our exhibitions on the screen.

Of course, we would be pleased to welcome you personally to our museum on Sundays.

- Basement: In the "Kerr" (that's Keller uff Durmerscherisch) we show the storage of our ancestors.

- Ground floor: In the "erschde Schdogg" you will find information about the local history as well as a room for pilgrimages.

- Upper floor: Now you are in the "zwoide Schdogg", where we show an apartment from the time around 1900 (kitchen, living room, parents' bedroom), hints about religious life and an old classroom.

In the hallway we refer to the Protestant parish in Durmersheim, which was founded in the middle of the 19th century.

- Top floor: The "Schbicher", i.e. the granary, used to store the grain.

We show you agricultural and forestry equipment - the hard work on the fields and in the woods shaped the daily routine of earlier generations.

In addition, we also take up the interesting topic of emigration in Durmersheim, when Durmersheim and Würmersheim became "economic refugees" out of poverty and misery and sought a better future for themselves and their children in Russia, Hungary, the Banat and overseas.

In the two chambers, where servants and maids used to live, we have set up a children's room and a craftsman's room (including a cobbler's bench). In this room you will also find information about club life and about the Jeni people living in Würmersheim.
